1 THE FOLLOWING IS A SUMMARY OF THE MARCH 12, 2009 CNAC MEETING 2

3 THE MEETING BEGAN AT 6:00 PM AND ENDED AT 8:10 PM.

5 THANK YOU TO MARY MAXWELL – MARYHELEN KINCAID

- The Port Director of Aviation, Mary Maxwell, who is retiring at the end of March, was introduced.
 CNAC Chair Maryhelen Kincaid presented Ms. Maxwell with a gift and thanked her for her
 support of CNAC and service to the community. Ms. Maxwell thanked the committee for their
 dedication and hard work and stated she has enjoyed knowing and working with the members.
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12 REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF FEBRUARY MEETING SUMMARY – MARYHELEN KINCAID

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Maryhelen Kincaid referred to the January meeting summary noting the spelling of Central NE
Neighborhood Coalition member, Bill Barber's name was incorrect. She requested the spelling
be corrected and stated the title of his neighborhood group - "Central NE Neighborhood
Coalition" - was incorrectly referenced. It was recorded as "...Association" and not "...Coalition"
which is the correct title. Both corrections were made and the January summary reposted on
the Port web site.

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A motion was made to accept the February meeting summary with the requested edits. The
 motion was seconded and approved.

NREX (NORTH RUNWAY EXTENSION) PROJECT COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROGRAM – DENNIS SANDSTROM

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27 Dennis Sandstrom, Community Affairs Intern for the Port briefed CNAC on the NREX

Communication Plan intended to keep the public informed of the progress and potential impacts of the north runway extension project and associated runway closures which begin May 1, 2009.

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NOISE ALERTS: EXPANDING COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION OF PLANNED MILITARY OPERATIONS AND SPECIAL EVENTS – JASON SCHWARTZ

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Noise Alerts are published on the Port's website and intended to notify the public of special conditions or events which may result in changes in airport operations or aircraft noise. Flight path changes due to weather and construction activities are typical examples of conditions that are described.

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Alerts are also issued when the Oregon Air National Guard (ORANG) is planning evening or
 weekend training; providing the community with advance notice of these operations and the fact

- 41 that they may notice aircraft noise at times other than when it is normally heard.
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- Jason told the members that early last month he had received calls from ORANG advising there
 would be afterburner departures at PDX in the days following the call. CNAC members were
- 44 would be alterburner departures at PDX in the days following the call. CNAC members were 45 notified and asked if this would be something they felt should be posted in a noise alert. Based
- 46 on CNAC's recommendation, noise alerts were issued describing this planned activity.
- 47 Based on CNAC input, Port staff and ORANG are exploring a process whereby ORANG will
- 48 (when possible) advise the Noise Department of planned/scheduled afterburner use, so
- 49 advance notification can be provided to the community.

52 **PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD**

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Vancouver resident, Merrily Graham, thanked Jerry Gerspach, Jason Schwartz, Paul Speer and
 former CNAC Vice Chair Dave Smith for meeting with her to discuss flight activity over her
 home near Esther Short Park. She stated they were very helpful and she appreciated the
 analysis done by Jerry.

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Ken Forcier from Concordia Neighborhood Association asked about Port sponsored rebates for installing windows that reduce aircraft noise. He mentioned the electric and gas companies offer different types of incentives to use their cost savings programs and was wondering if the Port is open to the same type of program. Jason informed him that there are federally funded and FAA programs available however there are very strict limitations on these programs. Jason offered to meet with Mr. Forcier after the meeting to discuss the topic in-depth.

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Koto Kishida from Cully Neighborhood spoke of concerns regarding safety issues associated
with the CDA overhead approach. She also asked about upcoming deadlines for a CNAC
recommendation on the testing of the CDA approach.

70 NOISE MANAGEMENT, FLY QUIET AND CDA UPDATE – JASON SCHWARTZ

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72 Jason provided data regarding the number of complaints received since the Continuous

73 Descent Approach (CDA) Overhead Approach test began last October. Typically aviation noise

complaints related to military operations are less than 5 - 10% of the total complaints annually.

However since the beginning of the Overhead Approach testing – military complaints have risen
 by approximately 35%. At the April 9 CNAC meeting, the Noise Team plans to have final data

77 regarding the number of CDA Overheads flown, complaint and additional noise data.

To date, very few of the complaints attributed to military operations can be directly correlated

with the overhead approach. Generally, callers are reporting they *heard* military operations

80 which they believed were the CDA overhead approaches when in actuality, after investigating

81 the complaint, the event was determined to be a routine military departure. In some cases, the 82 callers indicated "they were told to call whenever they heard the fighter jets."

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Jason also pointed out that the ORANG has been cooperative in educating visiting military
flights about the noise abatement procedures at PDX. This practice was initiated by ORANG in
support of the Port's noise management program's efforts to reduce community noise impacts.

A final presentation about the CDA overhead approach test will be made at the May meeting.
CNAC will discuss and possibly make a final recommendation regarding the future use of the
CDA overhead approach.

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95 NEIGHBORHOOD REPORTS, AIRPORT NOISE REPORT, NEXT MEETING'S AGENDA – MARYHELEN 96 KINCAID 97

98 Maryhelen opened the discussion on neighborhood reports.

100 Jason presented the CNAC Prioritization Matrix which outlines and prioritizes CNAC projects

101 and programs for 2009. He indicated this would be discussed at the April meeting. Additionally,

102 he presented a template for CNAC letterhead created by CNAC member Steve Kerman and 103 CNAC logo created by Noise Analyst Gregg Maxwell with input from the committee. 104 105 Jason reported to the committee that the Noise Department is working on a short guestionnaire 106 that will be sent to callers and community residents who have contact with the Noise 107 Management Department. The purpose of the questionnaire is to gather feedback regarding 108 the service provided and to explore ways to improve customer service when working with the 109 community. 110 111 Jason told the committee we are going to add a permanent agenda item to the CNAC agenda 112 for each subcommittee or taskforce to report on their monthly activities. 113 114 Gary Thornton reported that the Fly Quiet committee had their initial meeting the week prior [to 115 the CNAC meeting]. 116 117 Vicki Thompson reported the Communications and Outreach Task Force met as a group. They 118 came up with an initial list of areas to focus CNAC outreach efforts. Vicki handed out a list of 119 brainstorming topics and asked for CNAC feedback. The details of their work will be presented 120 at a future meeting. She solicited ideas from the committee regarding community outreach 121 activities. 122 123 Kelly Sweeney reported he visited two neighborhood meetings in the past month; (1) the Central 124 Northeast Neighborhood (CNN) Coalition Board meeting and, (2) the Beaumont Wilshire Neighborhood Association general session. At CNN he gave an overview of his background 125 and reasons for volunteering for CNAC. He also discussed his participation on the Public 126 127 Involvement subcommittee for the Airport Futures (Master Plan) project at PDX. He took a few 128 questions at this meeting - mostly about ORANG's CDA approaches. 129 130 At the Beaumont Wilshire meeting he introduced himself as a CNAC representative with the 131 desire to represent Beaumont Wilshire neighborhood which is where he lives. 132 133 At this time, Maryhelen asked the committee members for suggested agenda topics for the next 134 meeting. Vicki Thompson suggested CNAC invite someone from ORANG to a CNAC meeting 135 who can explain what their broader mission is in the region. This would help inform CNAC 136 members of their purpose. Jason indicated he will discuss the suggestion with ORANG and 137 schedule a presentation for an upcoming meeting. 138 139 There being no further business, a motion was made to adjourn the meeting. The motion was 140 seconded and passed.
