

Portion of Northeast Cornfoot Road to Close for Pipe Replacement Work

Beginning Monday, Sept. 26, 2016, a portion of Northeast Cornfoot Road near Northeast Alderwood will be closed to vehicle traffic through Nov. 10, 2016.



Cornfoot Road will remain open to local vehicle traffic only via Northeast 47th Ave.; however, the road will be open at all times to bike and pedestrian traffic.

The closure is necessary to install a new stormwater pipe underneath Cornfoot Road. The construction work will replace an 80-year old pipe that prevents flooding at Portland International Airport and surrounding properties. The timeframe takes into account rebuilding the

road and cure times of the concrete pavement. If work progresses faster than scheduled, the road will be reopened prior to Nov. 10.
