



Veterans Self-Identification Form

The Port of Portland is a federal contractor subject to the Vietnam Era Veterans Readjustment Act (VEVERAA), as amended. We take affirmative action to employ and advance in employment qualified veterans at all levels of employment. In accordance with our obligation under VEVRAA, we are extending this invitation to allow those who are covered veterans, as defined below, and who wish to benefit under our affirmative action program to self-identify for that purpose. If you would like to self-identify, please complete and upload as an attachment to your employment application, along with a copy of your DD-214 or DD-215 or equivalent certification from the Veterans' Administration. If you are a disabled veteran, you must also submit a copy of your Veteran's Disability Preference Letter from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. This information is voluntary and will be kept confidential, consistent with applicable regulations. The Port of Portland is also subject to the Oregon State Veterans' Preference Act, and invites employees to self-identify their status as either a veteran or disabled veteran as defined therein.

RECENTLY SEPARATED VETERAN YES NO

Any veteran during the three-year period beginning on the date of such veteran's discharge or release from active duty in the U.S. Military, ground, naval, or air service. Date of discharge release _____

ARMED FORCES SERVICE MEDAL VETERAN YES NO

Any veteran who, while serving on active duty in the U.S. military, ground, naval, or air service, participated in a United States military operation for which an Armed Forces service medal was awarded pursuant to Executive Order 12895 (61 FR 1209).

DISABLED VETERAN YES NO

Any veteran (A) of the U.S. military, ground, naval, or air service who is entitled to compensation (or who but for the receipt of military retired pay would be entitled to compensation) under laws administered by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, or (B) a person who was discharged or released from active duty because of a service-connected disability.

OTHER PROTECTED VETERAN YES NO

A veteran who served on active duty in the U.S. Military, ground, naval, or air service during a war or in a campaign or expedition for which a campaign badge has been authorized, under the laws administered by the Department of Defense. VETERAN as defined in Oregon Revised Statue 408.225 YES NO

A person who (A) Served on active duty with the Armed Forces of the United States: (i) For a period of more than 90 consecutive days beginning on or before January 31, 1955, and was discharged or released under honorable conditions; (ii) For a period of more than 178 consecutive days after or before January 31, 1955, and was discharged or released from active duty under honorable conditions; (iii) For 178 days or less and was discharged or released from active duty under honorable conditions because of a service-connected disability, (iv) For 178 days or less and was discharged or released from active duty under honorable conditions and has a disability rating from the United States Department of Veteran Affairs; or (v) For at least one day in a combat zone and was discharged or released from active duty under honorable conditions; or (B) Received a combat or campaign ribbon or expeditionary medal for services in the Armed Forces of the United States and was discharged or released from active duty under honorable conditions; (C) Is receiving a nonservice-connected pension from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.

DISABLED VETERAN as defined in Oregon Revised Statue 408.225 YES NO

A person entitled to disability compensation under laws administered by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, a person whose discharge or release from active duty was for a disability incurred or aggravated in the line of duty or a person who was awarded the Purple Heart for wounds received in combat.
