

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT TO THE PORT OF PORTLAND COMMISSION FOR JUNE 2021

SAFETY REPORT

Port of Portland May 2021 safety performance resulted in an increased frequency of Workers' Compensation claims reported compared to May 2020. There were five reported injury incidents in May 2021, of which three resulted in claims and all three resulted in Occupational Safety and Health Administration recordable incidents. There was also one property damage incident and one near-miss incident reported.

Monthly Report of Injury Incidents

Aviation

One recordable injury incident:

• A Maintenance employee was lifting a heavy, awkward signpost onto a truck when they felt a pop and sudden pain in their arm and shoulder.

Marine

One non-recordable injury incident:

• A Maintenance employee tripped and landed on a rail fastener, striking their knee.

One property damage incident:

• While out on patrol, a Marine Security Officer noticed smoke billowing out from a dumpster in the boneyard portion of Terminal 4. Upon further inspection, it was determined that there was a small fire in the dumpster, that had scrap metal and other discarded materials inside, and the Officer was able to put the fire out using both the fire extinguisher in their patrol rig and the fire extinguisher from the dock office.

Navigation

One near-miss incident:

The Site Safety and Health Officer observed some unsafe actions by the crew while
working on the new breastline scow: not wearing appropriate Personal protective
equipment (lifejackets, hardhats, face shield); welding was performed near flammables
(spray paint); a crew member rode a load as it was being lowered by a crane; and a
crew member was working on a partially suspended load.

Public Safety & Security

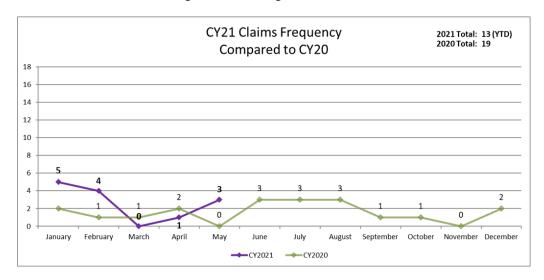
Two recordable injury incidents:

Police Officer was responding to a vehicle injury accident. The Officer approached the
intersection with sirens and lights activated and used the air horn several times; vehicles
stopped and as the Officer entered the intersection, another car sped through and hit the
front end of the police car.

• Police Officer was attempting to physically restrain resistive subject to place them under arrest. The Officer's finger was trapped between the subject and the pavement, causing a strain.

One non-recordable injury incident:

 Police Officer was investigating reports of a door ajar and wires exposed in a mechanical room. While walking around the room, the Officer looked down at an electrical panel door that was on the ground and hit their head on the corner of a heating, ventilation, and air conditioning duct, causing a small cut/abrasion.

<u>Passengers</u>

Portland International Airport (PDX) is beginning to show passenger growth. The April 2021 variance compared to April 2019 was -48.8%. May of the same two years shows an almost 10% increase in the last month.

Concessions Rent

Concessions at PDX benefitted from increased travel but not at the same rate. This can be attributed to concessionaires not being able to hire employees. The staffing shortage results in limited operating hours and unrealized revenue.

Rental Car Rent

Rental cars continue to struggle with acquiring vehicles to increase their fleet sizes. Rents are significantly higher for customers; therefore, revenue to the Port has exceeded Minimum Annual Guarantee for a few companies.

CAPITAL GRANTS

Portland International Airport

Staff submitted a reimbursement request to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) for the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act Grant Program in the amount of \$16,840,486 (Agreement No. 03-41-0048-085). This grant has been drawn in full, for a total funding amount of \$16,840,486.

Staff submitted a reimbursement request to the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) for the National Explosives Detection Canine Team program in the amount of \$51,361.37, covering the April 2021 work period (Agreement No. 70T02020T9NNCP466).

Staff submitted a reimbursement request to the TSA for the Law Enforcement Officer program in the amount of \$12,000, covering the April 2021 work period (Agreement No. HSTS0213HSLR647).
