## Meet the Interns: Jasmine Gilmore Sprints Across the Finish Line in Every Task




# Can you share a bit about your background and what drew you to apply for an internship at the Port?

I was born in Riverside, CA, but I've lived in the Portland area for most of my life. I graduated from Tualatin High School in 2015. Before coming to the Port, I was a barista/supervisor at Starbucks for 5 years while studying at Portland State.

My path to get here is a little different than the other internships. I'm interning through the Emerging Leaders Internship Program.
